**Title:** Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) FEMA AFG Grant

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

To accept an Assistance to Firefighters (AFG) grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in the amount of \$154,607.27 and authorize \$15,460.73 in local match funds.

## **BACKGROUND:**

The Fire Department submitted an application for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) and has been approved in the amount of \$154,607.27 in federal funding. As a condition of this grant, it is required that the city contribute non-federal funds equal to or greater than 10.0% of the federal funds awarded, or \$15,460.73 for a total approved budget of \$170,068.00.

## **DISCUSSION:**

The Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) will be dedicated to the fire department wellness programs, focusing on the health and well-being of our firefighters. This grant will cover initial physicals for all personnel, mental health screening, cancer screening and wellness training.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Staff will utilize existing budget allocation to cover the grant match.
