Statement of Interest

As an artist, I tend to incorporate my immediate environment into my work. When I was living in Oregon, evergreen trees began finding their way into my paintings. When I moved to the Coachella Valley in 2022, palm trees immediately started popping up in my drawings and eventually my paintings. My design for the top of the bench incorporates my abstracted palm tree imagery with a nod to the San Jacinto mountains in the background. The colors are inspired by a plant that I can see in my neighbor's yard, and the color of the sky just after dawn, looking east. Though I am a recent arrival in Cathedral City, Ocotillo Park is my local park. I have been walking my child there in her stroller since she was a newborn. The park has a special place in my heart, and I would be overjoyed to be a small part of it.

Though my sketch only depicts the top of the bench, I do plan on the design extending down the back portion.
